2 INFORMATION

3 STAY UP TO DATE

Routinely go to the different web pages and tune into the television channels and radio stations on your list to always be ready.

4 EVALUATE YOUR PROPERTY

Evaluate your property to make sure that the roofs, windows, and surroundings are ready and safe.

If necessary, purchase and install shutters to stay prepared.

5 EVALUATE YOUR CAR

Before a hurricane hits, make sure you have all your vehicles in safe places.

Always keep your car's fuel tank full, your routine maintenance to date, and prepare an emergency briefcase.

6 SUPPLIES

Make sure you have the following:

- Clean containers to store water for 3-5 days.
- A 3-5 day supply of non-perishable food.
- A portable radio, flashlights, batteries, and external chargers.
- · Sleeping bags or blankets.
- Personal hygiene supplies.
- Baby supplies (if needed)

7 MEDICATIONS

Don't forget to have:

- Medications that you and your family may need.
- A first aid kit and manual.
- Water purifiers.

8 CHECK YOUR GENERATOR

Make sure your generator's maintenance is up to date and has a full tank of fuel. Open an account with American Petroleum and keep the phone number close by for any supplies needed.
